Taiwan's Education System

In Taiwan, students can pursue higher education at 2-year and 4-year colleges and universities. Undergraduate programs usually require 4 years of study; graduate programs leading to a master degree require 1 to 4 years, and doctoral programs require 2 to 7 years. In most institutions of higher education, the academic year has two semesters: the first semester is from August to the following January, and the second semester begins in February and ends in July.



Expenses for Studying in Taiwan

Taiwan is well-known as a country where you can enjoy high quality education and modern living at affordable costs. Typical costs for studying in Taiwan are set out below:

MOE Taiwan Scholarship

- Duration: Undergraduate program (max. 4 years), Master's (max. 2 years), PhD (max. 4 years)
- Tuition and miscellaneous expenses up to TWD 40,000 each semester
- Monthly stipend: TWD 15,000 for undergraduate programs, TWD 20,000 for Master's or PhD programs
- For recipients from eligible countries as designated

Academia Sinica Taiwan International Graduate Program

- Duration: 3 years maximum
- Monthly stipend: TWD 34,000
- Eligibility: Applicants must possess a bachelor's or master's degree, or the equivalent, from a foreign university or independent college accredited by the Ministry of Education of Toiwan
